Sinan Antoon is an Iraqi-born poet, novelist, scholar, translator, and associate professor at the Gallatin School for Individualized Study at New York University. Sinan Antoon studied at the University of Baghdad, Georgetown University, and Harvard University. He has published two collections of poetry and four novels, and his literary works have been translated into fourteen languages. His scholarly publications include *The Poetics of the Obscene: Ibn al-Hajjaj and Sukhf* (Palgrave, 2014) and articles on the poetry of Mahmoud Darwish, Sargon Boulus, and Saadi Youssef. His most recent work is *The Book of Collateral Damage* (Yale University Press, 2019).
